Behind the Scenes of Giants Firefighter Appreciation Night: Q&A with Mack Douglas of the SF Giants

SF Fire recently joined the San Francisco Giants in hosting the second annual Firefighter Appreciation Night with a pre-game tailgate open to the public at China Basin Park. Food trucks, live music, ticket giveaways and cash prizes were on hand for all to enjoy and have a chance to win. The Siren recently sat down with Mack Douglas, Parks Program Manager for the SF Giants, to hear what it's like working with community partners like SF Fire and how events like the tailgate help to recognize the firefighter community while cultivating the Giants fanbase. Following are excerpts from the conversation.

Siren: Please tell me a little bit about your role with the SF Giants. What part of the business are you in, how long have you been there, what inspires you to come to work every day?

Mack Douglas: My role with the Giants is to bring events to life at China Basin Park, which is a new public park across McCovey Cove from the stadium. For the last three seasons. I've worked with community partners like SF Fire to help make their vision a reality; they are a big part of the culture and experience of a Giants game. Helping to make memories for our fans and partners is what inspires me to come to work every day. Whether it's a kid getting to sit in a fire truck, or an attendee having the opportunity to meet the fire chief, that event (and events like it) enhance our fan experience tremendously. I try to keep in mind that a regular workday for me might be something that kids or parents remember for the rest of their lives.



Siren: SF Giants recently hosted Firefighter Appreciation Night. Why are firefighters an important audience for the Giants?

Mack Douglas: At the Giants, we work very closely with the SF Fire Department to ensure the safety and well-being of our fans. The exceptional service provided to us by our Port and City firefighters is impossible to overstate. Firefighters are an important audience for us because of how essential they are to our success. It was great to be able to focus on their contributions and achievements for a night at the ballpark.

Siren: What was your favorite part of Firefighter Appreciation Night this year?

Mack Douglas: The fireboat is always a highlight, and it was a pleasure to meet the new fire chief. But for me, the biggest highlight was seeing how many people came together to celebrate firefighters throughout the Bay Area. It was special



for us to see such a massive segment of the firefighter community show up and celebrate one another.

Siren: The Giants relocated to San Francisco in 1958, just seven years after SF Fire CU was founded. What does it mean to the Giants to have such deep roots in San Francisco?

Mack Douglas: We've taken the representation of San Francisco very seriously since day one. It has been a privilege to evolve with the city over the decades, and even more of a privilege to have the unwavering support of our fanbase through good times and bad. Our roots are in reflecting the values of San Francisco in everything we do.

Based on member feedback, there will be a limit of **4 banker boxes** per household (15"x12"x10"; 1,800 cubic inches; 30 lbs; 2000-5000 sheets depending on paper weight) or a total of 120 lbs of paper.

Documents will be shredded on-site. Be sure to remove any large binder clips, but there's no need to worry about removing small paper clips and staples. Unfortunately, we cannot accept photos, VHS tapes, DVDs, binders, books or cardboard boxes.

This is a member only, first-come, first-served service. If the trucks reach full capacity before your turn, we cannot guarantee all attendees will be able to shred their documents.
